#### From the archives.

What were we doing 10 years ago?



The radio site is at Currajung in the Strzelecki range south of Traralgon. The name of the event is unknown however may be David Nutter Ford rally run on 4th March 2006. (If anyone knows the full event name, please let us know.)



The radio equipment is what we used for our repeater system at the time. The repeater radio was a Phillips FM828. These radios were widely used for Amateur and CB repeaters due to their unique design of having completely separate receiver

and transmitter units within the one radio. Unfortunately these days they don't meet the required specifications for channel spacing and band width so can no longer be used for our repeaters. We now use



two separate radios for our repeaters, one for the receiving and one for transmitting function.

The site was a good one as it had mains power so only a backup battery was needed. Indeed a luxury we don't get very often.

The Cavity diplexer seen in this setup is now used at our more permanent Melbourne repeater site. This type of cavity system does not take well to being transported all over the place so is better suited to a more permanent site.
